



## Where is Cosca Regional Park?



#### **Basic Facts**

- Located in Clinton, MD, in the southern area of Prince George's County
- The second largest of 4 Regional Parks in Prince George's County
- Home to a wide array of active recreation features such as athletic fields and tennis courts, a campground, picnic facilities, playgrounds, a skatepark, and a boathouse
- Home to hiking, biking, and equestrian trails, the Clearwater Nature Center, and Thrift Schoolhouse

## **How Big is Cosca?**



#### Scale

- At 800.39 acres in size, Cosca Regional Park is similar in size to New York City's Central Park (843 acres) and slightly smaller than Watkins Regional Park in Upper Marlboro, MD (839 acres)
- Approximately 77 acres of the park are developed for active recreation uses
- Approximately 221 acres of the park are currently protected from development by the Tree Conservation Program



## Cosca's Findings

#### What Have We Learned To Date?

- 1. The park's landform and its topography present significant challenges to park management, park maintenance, and enhanced vehicular and pedestrian connectivity and accessibility.
- 2. The park's infrastructure and building stock is aging and not always accessible.
- 3. Activity areas within the park are geographically dispersed, most are invisible to each other, and few are connected by vehicular drives or ADA accessible routes.
- 4. The Gems What makes Cosca Extra Special Cosca Lake, undeveloped and extensive woodlands, and productive agricultural lands.


Areas of Cosca Regional Park

Therefore, our mission is to determine the combination of land, facilities and programs that will provide the right experiences for Prince Georgians in the future.







#### **Park Vision Statement**



Cosca Regional Park will build upon its **natural assets**, expanding its recreational opportunities while promoting **stewardship** and celebration of the park's natural splendor. The Clearwater Nature Center is repositioned to serve as the portal for exploring the park's natural and recreational activities. Cosca's natural resources will be protected, utilizing the park's varied **topography and woodlands** to develop and structure **innovative** approaches to outdoor activities.

Cosca Regional Park's facilities and programming will be expanded to engage **underserved audiences**, providing appropriate reinvestment in **infrastructure** and amenities to increase **accessibility** and maximize universal design and inclusion. The heart of the park, **Cosca Lake**, will be reimagined to enhance its aesthetic appeal and ecological functioning, while providing increased recreational opportunities. Cosca Regional Park will connect inside and out, providing better **connectivity and wayfinding** within and strengthening connections to surrounding neighborhoods and the County as a whole.

Cosca Regional Park will further expand its role as a **regional destination** within the Department of Parks and Recreation System, becoming the County's showpiece for **nature-oriented adventure**, **play**, **and education**.











#### A PLACE FOR ALL

Cosca Regional Park will **expand its programming and park activities** to better provide equitable access to recreational services based on population and recreational trends, with a **focus on better serving multi-generational visitors**, **young adults without children**, **tweens**, and **middle and high schoolers**.

Recognizing that Cosca Regional Park invites pedestrians, bicyclists, equestrians, and those using skateboards, scooters, wheelchairs or strollers to enjoy its many park features, park improvements and renovations will be **ADA compliant** and maximize **universal design**.











#### A SOLID FOUNDATION

Cosca Regional Park was opened in the early 1970s and much of the park infrastructure is showing its age. The addition and expansion of park activities will require new **investment in supporting infrastructure**—water, sewer, electrical, and vehicular circulation and parking.










#### **EASY NAVIGATION**

At over 800 acres, Cosca Regional Park is currently broken into activity areas with little or no connection. Due to the lack of wayfinding and directional signs, park visitors are easily lost when navigating between park offerings. Every effort will be made to increase connectivity between the park's nodes of activity and to strengthen these connections through a clear and comprehensive wayfinding program.

Park entrances will be enhanced with colorful plantings embracing new, highly visible architectural signage to beckon and orient new and returning park visitors.







#### PARK AS PLAYGROUND

Cosca Regional Park is a place that takes advantage of its terrain and creates opportunities for all ages, young and old, to try new activities, gain new skills, and to enhance and expand exercise options through active and visual play.

With large expanses of open space, Cosca has the land area to support a variety of **outdoor activity and play experiences for all ages**. Expanded opportunities for play can be as simple as creating a public art destination for visual enjoyment or incorporating the park's terrain into a BMX bike or pump track for physical activity or adding adult exercise stations along the trail network for as activity centers.











#### **OUTDOOR DISCOVERY**

Cosca Regional Park will provide outdoor-oriented education opportunities primarily targeted toward youth, yet available to all ages.

Participants will better understand the richness of the park's outdoor environment through discovery and inclusive programming focused on project-based learning, skill-building, community service, and mentorship programs.











#### STEWARDSHIP & SUSTAINABILITY

Protection and enhancement of Cosca Regional Park's natural environment and its beauty is an overarching driver of the master plan's formulation.

The park's natural features serve as a recreational amenity and perform important environmental functions. Extensive areas of intact forest, native plants, and active wildlife surround the park's most well-known feature, a freshwater lake used for recreational fishing and boating. These features, and the park's Historic Thrift Schoolhouse, will be stewarded using environmentally responsible and sustainable techniques.







- Develop northern end of park as Adventure Place dog park, splash pad, rectangular field, BMX or pump track, parking, playground, restrooms, picnic shelters, parkour






