Adult turkeys are equipped with sharp bony spurs, which they use to defend themselves from predators like coyotes. While they usually run when scared, turkeys can fly up to 50 miles per hour over short distances. They will need to use their skills, as coyotes have been spotted waiting in the location where the turkeys gather.

Green Heron (Butorides virescens)

The green heron was spotted sitting on a log during one of our pontoon boat tours down the Anacostia River. They can stand motionless as they hunt for fish and amphibians. The green herons live in both salt and fresh water shorelines. They have webs between their middle and outer toes and are able to swim. They will occasionally dive for deep-water prey. They are migratory and will return in late March or April.

A Baby Out of Place

Mississippi Map Turtle

(Graptemys pseudogeographica kohni)

This baby map turtle was discovered on the floating wetlands in the park. Its carapace is covered with mud. They are native along the Mississippi, Missouri and Ohio rivers and are non-native to Maryland. Please do not release non-native turtles in Maryland waters. Non-native species can become invasive. To help protect native species, do not purchase the map turtle if you can not keep them through adulthood. By the way, they can live for decades.




